

## **Thames Valley Priorities Committee Commissioning Policy Statement**

**Dupuytren's Contracture Release**

the Priorities Committee:**

**May 2015, updated September 2017 and October 2020<sup>1</sup>**

**Date of issue:**

**December 2020**

Treatment for Dupuytren's Contracture will be funded in line with the NHS England (2018; updated 2019) Evidence Based Interventions Statutory Guidance:

An intervention (needle fasciotomy, fasciectomy and dermofasciectomy) will be considered for:

- finger contractures causing loss of finger extension of 30° or more at the metacarpophalangeal joint or 20° at the proximal interphalangeal joint.

**OR**

- severe thumb contractures which interfere with function

Radiation therapy for early Dupuytren's disease is not normally funded due to lack of high quality evidence of clinical effectiveness.
